The GSK Carbon Neutral Laboratories for Sustainable Chemistry - Official Opening 27 February 2017

The new state-of-the-art GSK Carbon Neutral Laboratories building was officially opened by Sir Andrew Witty on 27 February 2017. The event was well attended by University of Nottingham staff, industrial and funding partners (such as GSK, HEFCE and the Wolfson Foundation), current students and alumni.

On the second day the students were joined by academics from the Schools of Chemistry and Biosciences and the Faculty of Engineering who showcased their research and discussed the research opportunities in their respective groups.
